The analysis of primary and secondary data reveals several important insights regarding freelancing and the concept of a Freelance Services Hub in India.

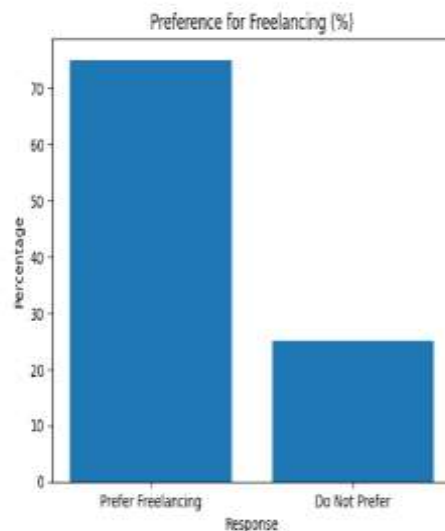

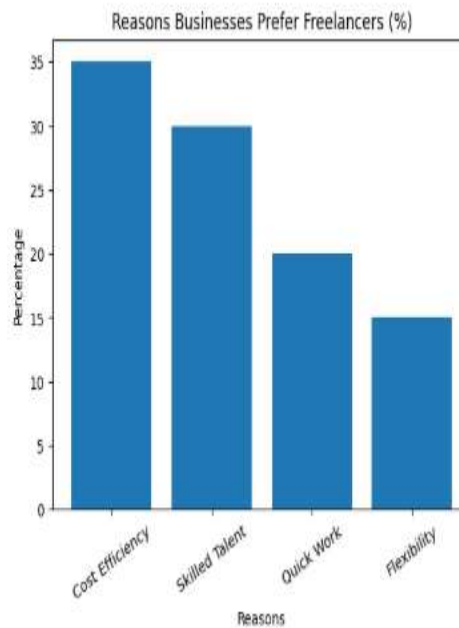
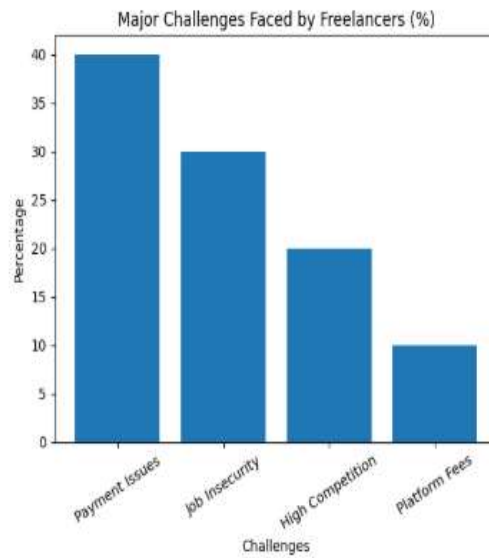
