Findings:

Number of 88 (31.7%) and 55 (19.8%) students agreed that they have plenty of time but they don't feel to utilize it for studies 72 (25.9%) students were neutral and 28 (10.1%) and 35 (12.6%) students disagree.

11. I am not revising study as there is no confirmed schedule of examination (277 responses received)

Number of 95 (34.3%) 53 (19.1%) students agreed that they are not revising study 62 (22.4%) students were neutral and 31 (11.2%) and 36 (13%) students were disagreed.

12. E learning is pleasant experience for me.

For 69 (25.1%) and 56 (20.4%) students E learning was a pleasant experience 87 (31.6%) students were neutral and 25 (9.1%) and 38 (13.8%) students disagreed

- 13. Managing study through virtual support of teacher is quiet motivating. (273 responses received)
- For 68 (24.9%) and 54 (19.8%) students are agreed that managing study through virtual support of teacher is motivating, 94 (34.4%) students were neutral and 32 (11.7%) and 25 (9.2%) students disagreed.
- 18. I have tried to learn different skills during Lockdown period (276 responses received)
- 98 (35.5%) and 65 (23.6%) students tried to learn different skills during lockdown, 65 (23.6%) students were neutral and 26 (9.4%) and 22 (8%) disagreed
- 25. Virtual learning is an interesting way of learning (271 responses received)
- 69 (25.5%) and 67 (24.7%) students agreed that virtual learning is an interesting way for learning 86 (31.7%) students were neutral and 23 (8.5%) and 26 (9.6%) disagreed
- 26. Online Learning is a most compatible way of learning as it provide comfort and convenience (273 responses received)
- 50 (18.3%) and 53 (19.4%) students were agree that online learning is most compatible way of learning it also provide comfort and convenience, 100 (36.6%) students were neutral and 42 (15.4%) and 28 (10.3%) students disagreed
- 27. Creating classroom environment at home is impossible (274 responses received)
- 98 (35.8%) 43 (15.7%) students agreed that it is possible to create 60 (21.9%) students were neutral 40 (14.6%) and 33 (12%) students disagreed.

- 31 (47.8%) and 50 (18.2%) students agreed that they are missing teacher and friends presence at the time of study, 50 (18.2%) students were neutral and 19 (6.9%) and 24 (8.8%) students disagreed

- 34 (48.9%) and 53 (19.3%) students agreed about their worries about studies and results due to uncertainty, 48 (17.5%) students were neutral about it and 11 (4%) and 28 (10.2%) students disagreed

- 79 (28.7%) students strongly agreed and 61 (22.2%) students agreed that it is challenging to get internet access during lockdown, 72 (26.2%) students were neutral and 31 (11.3%) students were disagree and 32 (11.6%) students strongly disagree

- 101 (37.1%) students strongly agreed and 64 (23.5%) students agreed that syllabus completion and deadline of study are adversely affected due to lock down, 56 (20.6%) students were neutral and 27 (9.9%) students disagreed and 24 (8.8%) students strongly disagreed.

- 26 (46.3%) students strongly agreed and 47 (17.3%) students agreed that online learning needs internet data pack and speed which is not affordable every time, 47 (17.3%) students were neutral and 31 (11.4%) students disagreed and 21 (7.7%) students strongly disagreed.

- 32 (47.8%) students strongly agreed and 54 (19.6%) students agreed that the lockdown is challenging for students, 47 (17%) students were neutral and 20 (7.2%) students disagreed 23 (8.3%) students strongly disagreed

Following are the challenges students faced during lock down and maximum number of students need support to overcome those challenges.

Online learning needs internet data pack and speed which is not affordable every time. They are not much aware about technology which hampers my learning habits.
